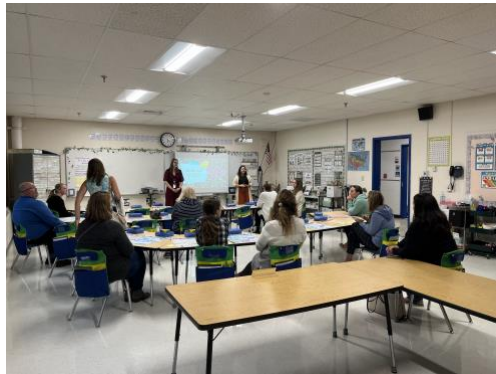


### Open House

### Data Teams

Grade level teams and interventionists met to review fall benchmark data for mathematics and reading. The purpose of these meetings is to examine grade-wide, class level and individual data to determine strengths & weaknesses and create an action plan for any grade-wide or classroom specific modifications to the curriculum; identify risk groups by class, determine necessary measures to further develop diagnostic profiles for small group instruction and determine groupings for Tier 2 and Tier 3 intervention.

## School Safety

The safety and security of students and staff is our top priority. The week of September 19<sup>th</sup> the Moore School participated in the “*If You See Something, Say Something®*” campaign. The goal of this campaign is to raise public awareness about the importance of reporting suspicious activity. Mr. Banks utilized several of the “*If You See Something, Say Something®*” public service announcements during his morning announcements and posters reminding students to report suspicious activity are hanging throughout the building as well. Our involvement in this campaign was initiated by a Candia School Board goal.

Also, as part of our ongoing efforts to help students feel prepared in the case of an emergency situation, Mrs. Poulin visited classrooms this week to discuss different emergency situations with students. Mrs. Poulin is a member of our Emergency Management Team and is very skilled at talking with students of all ages about this topic.

## Student Services Update

The Student Services Team has had a strong start to the school year. As a new Director and with a new Administrative Assistant, it was important to spend the first month of school getting to know staff, students and families. In addition, the team was able to develop goals based on the strengths of the team and areas they identified for improvement. Our focus has been to develop systems as a team to ensure legal compliance with the special education process, procedures to reduce the amount of time special education team members are spending on paperwork to increase their time with students, and to build the capacity of all team members to meet the needs of diverse learners. We have used our technology to create forms, templates, and data tracking tools that allow us to focus on students and learning. Students have returned to school eager to learn. Special education staff has also been working hard to consult and connect with classroom teachers to create classroom environments that support all learners.
