

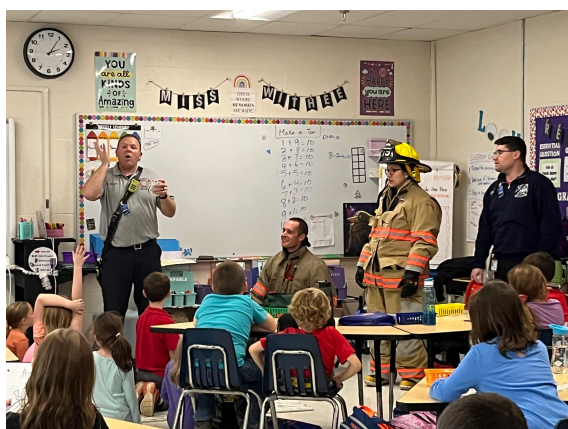

Athletic Update

Our soccer and cross country teams had fabulous seasons. Our co-ed soccer team included 14 players from grades 6-8. They ended the season strong with a record of 6-3-1 finishing in 4th place after a 5-4 loss to Saint Christopher Academy in the playoffs. A big thank you to our coach, Kim Grandmaisson, who stepped up to give the kids an opportunity to play this year.

The cross country team was able to race in eight meets this season, including the State Meet on Saturday, October 22nd. The team was enthusiastic, and worked hard. Jason Robie was our boys team leader with several first place finishes and 2nd place overall in the state. Our girl's top runner was Ellie Cox who finished the state race with a time of 15:02. We are very proud of Jason, Ellie and all of our cross country runners.



Student Services Update

At the start of the school year, the Student Services Team set goals for the school year that included developing systems to support the special education process and to identify areas the team would like to focus on when developing new Individual Education Plans (IEPs). Professional development has included specialized training for case management, preschool coordination, special education administrative assistants and a new directors training. Staff who attend these training sessions are then able to bring what they have learned back to the special education team. The team has a weekly time built into the schedule to share new learning, problem solve, discuss students and for additional professional development. On October 26th, the student services team held their fall Child Find event which gives parents of children under the age of six to have their child screened in the areas of communication, motor and early learning skills. A Child Find Screening will be held again in the spring.

In addition, new procedures were developed and are being implemented to identify and support students who may require targeted intervention in the areas of reading, math, social/emotional skills, motor and communication. This includes ongoing progress monitoring for all students, opportunities for teachers to review student progress and for teams to provide interventions as soon as a need arises to ensure students are making progress. Based on student needs, interventions can include additional learning opportunities in the classroom, small group targeted instruction with a specialist or some targeted individualized instruction.

Red Ribbon Week

Moore school students pledged to “*Celebrate Life and Live Drug Free*” with several Red Ribbon Week activities the week of October 24-28. Students created posters, crafted a positive affirmations paper chain, participated in health lessons about making healthy choices, dressed for theme days such as “Team Up Against Drugs” and “Peace Out to Drugs” and more. Thank you to th Moore School Red Ribbon Week Team for putting together this fund and educational week for students.
